

**Interim Federal Health Program (IFHP)  
Update to the Reimbursement Policy  
Prescription Drug Program – Saskatchewan**

June 2014

Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) recently advised you of changes in the reimbursement policy for the IFHP prescription drug program in Saskatchewan effective April 1, 2014.

An additional change has been made to the urine testing agents, diabetic strips and diabetic supplies reimbursement policy. Here is the updated information.

| Description  | Reimbursement Policy – CIC (IFHP)                         |
|--|---|
| Dispensing Fee (regular)   | \$11.25   |
| Dispensing Fee (Compounded Products, all)                                    | \$16.88 (150% of the dispensing fee for regular products) |
| Dispensing Fee - Urine testing agents, diabetic strips and diabetic supplies | 50% of the cost   |

The mark-up fees (based on product cost):

- \$0.00 - \$6.30 = 30%
- \$6.31 - \$15.80 = 15%
- > \$15.81 = 10% (maximum of \$20.00 for product cost higher than \$200.00)
